

## Project "Easy Towns 2.0 – European Accessible Sustainable Young Towns II" Programme: Europe for citizens Strand 2 – Measure 2.2 "Networks of Towns" Democratic engagement and civic participation

The project "Easy Towns 2.0 - European Accessible Sustainable Young Towns II" is a project built in joint cooperation with partners from 12 cities from 11 European countries and deals with youth, intercultural dialogue, inclusion, integration and cultural heritage. The main aim of the project is to gather good practices and explore how citizens through art and cultural heritage can be agents of local change, encourage dialogue and contribute to the policy-making process.

The goal of the project partners is to create a good example of how city residents, through their active participation, can significantly influence changes in local politics and shape what happens in cities.

Through this project, young people want to support cities in involving a greater number of citizens in bringing about change, mainly using art and culture as a means to achieve the goals. All the partner cities are well known for their local cultural heritage (UNESCO sites, EU Capitals of Culture - past and future) and this is an important element of pride for their citizens, something they know well and which appeals to them. For this reason, cultural heritage is placed at the center of the project to show citizens how diversity is behind every form of culture and art and contributes to their beauty. The local material, nonmaterial and natural heritage is revisited by the youth to become a channel through which the EU values of peace, respect and cooperation between different cultures are transmitted.
